



Nottinghamshire Fire and Rescue Service (NFRS) is committed to the safety, care and protection of the people of Nottinghamshire

The Service is committed to creating a safer Nottinghamshire. In 2018, firefighters attended over 11,000 emergency calls, not only relating to fires, but also to road traffic collisions and rescues involving water, animals and height. Our firefighters undertake a valuable, varied and complex service for the people of Nottinghamshire.

Attending incidents and delivering a highly qualified and skilled response is one part of our commitment to those who live and work in Nottinghamshire. Another important aspect is delivering effective prevention work. Our staff actively visit people at home, at school and in business to provide advice and support.

Within the last year, NFRS staff have carried out thousands of Safe and Well checks, fitting smoke alarms where they are desperately needed and giving valuable advice, to increase public safety. We also work closely with local businesses, helping them to keep their employees safer from fire and other incidents when at work.

This year we need £41.4m to carry on this work in what is a demanding, changing environment. The Nottinghamshire and City of Nottingham Fire Authority has therefore approved a council tax increase of 2.95% for the services that we provide. This represents an extra £2.29 per year contribution for those living in a Council Tax Band D property.
