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1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1 The Local Firefighter Pension Board (LFPB) is responsible for assisting the Scheme Manager in ensuring the effective governance and administration of the firefighter pension schemes. In order to fulfil this responsibility, it is important that Board members are aware of significant pension issues and can be assured that these issues are being dealt with.
- 1.2 West Yorkshire Pension Fund is engaged as the scheme administrator and provides a monthly report to each of its fire service clients. The latest report for June 2026 is attached as an appendix and acts as the detailed report.

2. REPORT

2.1 The reports typically include a range of member and process statistics and information, an administration update, communication and training update, the internal audit five-year programme, a calendar of events and a helpful extract of actions arising from the latest LGA Firefighters' Pensions Scheme monthly bulletin.

2.2 The report is provided to the Board by way of this standalone agenda item, rather than as part of the Scheme Manager's report. This is in recognition of its significance and to facilitate a clearer link with the verbal update by a Fund representative.
